



## **KiKa funding options and application procedures**

Financial support can be requested by researchers working at a scientific institution in the Netherlands. Support can be requested for fundamental, clinical, epidemiological or psychological research. **Research for which financial support is requested should have a clear link with childhood cancer.**

### **Funding types**

KiKa has following types of funding:

#### **Research projects:**

- The most common form of research, that evolves around 1 or multiple research questions.
- In principle, a project can have a maximum of 2 project leaders. Proper justification should be provided in case more than 2 project leaders are assigned.
- It is allowed to collaborate with international research groups for a research project, if there is a clear added value of this collaboration. A maximum of 49% of the total requested budget can be assigned to the part of the research that is performed abroad.
- Max. 4 years
- The budget that can be requested is not limited. However, the requested amount should naturally correspond with the proposed work and requisites.
- Indication for size of research project is a maximum of 1 FTE scientific personnel and 1 FTE non-scientific personnel per year. It is possible to request more personnel. In that case, this should be well substantiated in the application.

#### **Pilot projects:**

- Pilot projects have the specific aim to explore the feasibility of an **extraordinary, innovative** research proposal. The aim of a pilot project is to determine if a research proposal offers viable opportunities. If successful, a pilot project will form the basis for a research project.
- In principle, a pilot project can have a maximum of 2 project leaders. Proper justification should be provided in case more than 2 project leaders are assigned.
- Max. 1,5 years
- The budget that can be requested is not limited. However, the requested amount should naturally correspond with the proposed work and requisites.
- Indication for size of research project is a maximum of 1 FTE personnel per year. It is possible to request more personnel. In that case, this should be well substantiated in the application.

### Programs:

- The funding type “program” is specifically designed for elaborate research proposals, consisting of multiple complementary work packages.
- Programs for instance enable tackling of multiple (multidisciplinary) research questions within an overarching research project and enable projects which require large or complex collaborations.
- The added value of a program over multiple research projects should be argued convincingly.
- A clear plan for valorisation and translation of the results, generated within a program, should be composed.
- It is allowed to collaborate with international research groups for a research program, if there is a clear added value of this collaboration. A maximum of 49% of the total requested budget can be assigned to the part of the research that is performed abroad.
- Max. 6 years, max €3 million

Data generated within any type of funding should be made publicly available, unless they require specific protection. If confidential data are generated, the strategy to protect these data should be described.

### Public-private partnerships (pilot call 2024)

KiKa yearly gets a PPS-allowance from Health Holland.

Researchers in pediatric oncology can submit a PPS application to KiKa.

The KiKa scientific boards will advise if KiKa should contribute to funding of an application via it's PPS allowance. The final submission and assessment will be via health holland.

### **Submitting an application for funding**

January 2023: due to technical issues, the online form cannot be used for submission of research proposals for the February deadline. Please send your word application template form, budget tool, and all other documents (such as figures and letters of intent) via email to [research@kika.nl](mailto:research@kika.nl).

Full program applications cannot be submitted online. Researchers that have been invited to submit a full program application based on their program pre-application, will receive information about the application procedure.

In case of a resubmission or adapted form of a previously submitted proposal: please make clear in which way the proposal is adapted (via an accompanying letter and, if applicable, visually highlighting the parts of the text that have been adapted).

### Research projects and pilot projects:

KiKa aims to for a careful yet fast and efficient reviewing process. We aim to complete the reviewing process within four months.

When a project application is submitted at the latest on one of the following dates (23:59), the project will be discussed at the next scientific board meeting.

-1 February  
-1 June  
-1 October

### Programs

Programs proposals are reviewed once a year. Program pre-applications should be submitted before **1 April**. Applicants will be invited to discuss the preapplication on **24 May**. Invitations for full program applications will be sent in the beginning of June. Full applications should be submitted before **1 October**. This procedure can be adapted or accelerated in case KiKa considers this necessary.

#### Public-private partnerships

Submitting application to KiKa: **1 August 2024**. Deadline Health Holland: **1 October 2024**. It is possible to submit a preapplication (summary on 1 A4). KiKa will give feedback if the proposal fits within its research scope and within the conditions set by health holland: **1 May 2024**.
